- Magnolia High School will provide high-quality curriculum and instruction to all students by creating the School Plan for Student Achievement. The SPSA addresses three goals: Creating College and Career prepared students, providing meaningful parent and family engagement opportunities, and providing a safe and positive campus for students.
- Back to School Night and Open House/Steamapalooza will be planned to offer parents a chance to visit classrooms, speak to teachers, and see student work.
- Parent learning walks will be scheduled throughout the year to allow parents and family members to observe and discuss curriculum in action.
- Parents will be responsible to check Aeries and eKadence on a regular basis, and to check report cards.
- Individualized Education Program (IEP) meetings are held for students with special education plans. These meetings include parents, teachers, counselors and administrators to provide additional support to students and families.
- The Family and Community Engagement Specialist (FACES) will operate the Parent Center, arrange for workshops and parent training opportunities, and will support and help the PTA. The FACES will make weekly phone calls to the entire Magnolia community, and also email messages. The FACES will also make personal phone calls to parents, and interpret for Spanish speaking parents.
- Parents and Families will be offered many varied workshops and classes, including Ready, Set, Go!, Coffee with the Principal, Cookies with Counselors, Disciplina Positiva, Parent Leadership Academy, and more.
- Ready, Set, Go! Helps parents to improve their understanding of student expectations and helps parents improve the achievement of their children. This 3-week course provides parents with tools to engage with school staff, teachers, administrators, and feel more comfortable navigating the Aeries, Parent Square, and eKadence platforms.

- Various meetings will be held during the year that help to educate parents about the State Academic standards, including meetings regarding AP and PSAT testing and classes, ELPAC, the Anaheim Pledge, college financial aid and more.
- Workshops will be offered to support social-emotional well-being of students.
- Mindfulness training will be offered in Vietnamese, Spanish, and English.
- Parents and families are encouraged to volunteer and participate at school in a variety of ways, including joining the PTA, School Site Council, ELAC committee, Puente Parent committee, Dual Enrollment Parent Advisory committee, Cyber Parent meetings, and attending LCAP meetings. Families are also encouraged to attend events such as Lunch with a Sentinel, Honor Roll dinner and a movie night, College Signing Day, and other events such as International Night, VAPA events, and athletic events and contests.
- One-to-one devices (Chromebooks) will be provided to all students. Hot spots will be provided as needed for internet access at home.
- The Capstone Portfolio will be instituted to provide students a way to showcase their learning throughout their years of high school. Parents will be asked to take training and serve on the Capstone Review committees with teachers and staff members.
- Tutoring will be available to all students in math, science, social science, and English by teachers, by Anaheim Achieves staff, by AVID tutors and by peers.
- ETS and other groups and partners provide academic support for students throughout the year.
- Saturday Academies are offered as extra-curricular time for students to make up missing assignments, work on projects and portfolios, or participate in positive extra-curricular activities, clubs, or athletics. Parent Saturday Academies are also offered in a variety of topics.
- The MACC will offer student and parent tours and events connecting students to STEM topics and environmental issues.

- Parents are also expected to attend a Freshmen Orientation for parents and students during registration in either July or August.
- Parent-teacher conferences can be arranged at any time for interested parents.
- Report cards and progress reports will be emailed or provided in Aeries; however, grades are available at all times on Aeries.
- Parent Learning Walks will be scheduled throughout the year.
- The FACES will provide a weekly phone call and Email to all parents providing current information about events at school, parent opportunities, community events, and more.
- The Parent Center will be open every day for parents. The FACES will provide Aeries training as needed to interested parents.
- Teachers will use the Parent Square communication tool in Aeries, which will also send home a message in the home language.
- Translators are provided for all parent events, and wireless communications devices are used for simultaneous translation.
